RELIGIOUS IN COLOMBIA ACT TO GIVE MORE ATTENTION TO TODAY'S SOCIAL PROBLEMS:

Some 1,000 Religious attending a Congress on Spirituality in Bogota, Colombia resolved that they will pay more attention to the social problems of the present day. The Congress approved resolutions recommending that priests Brothers and Sisters be trained to deal with such concrete problems as LABOR, HOUSING AND WELFARE NEEDS. The Religious also asked that teaching congregations establish and widen their activities in the SOCIAL APOSTOLATE.

Attending the meeting were 1,000 Religious from Colombia and 66 delegates from 14 other Latin American countries and the United States.
